Call for contributions - PhD summaries

As of 2024, *New Zealand Sociology* intends to annually publish summaries of recently completed PhD theses to showcase and add visibility to the wide range of sociological scholarship being generated by emerging researchers in Aotearoa New Zealand.

We now invite all PhD candidates or graduates who have graduated and/or successfully defended their PhD dissertation in the year 2023 to submit a summary to *New Zealand Sociology*. The summaries will be published in Volume 39, Issue 1, in March 2024.

The PhD summaries should be no more than 600 words (excluding references and other information) and provide an overview of the thesis with a focus on key insights, novel contributions to knowledge and suggestions for further research.

In detail, summaries should address the following questions:

- What are the research objectives and questions?
 - What are the key findings and major conclusions?
 - What contributions does the dissertation make to advancing knowledge in its field?
 - What avenues for further research does the dissertation suggest?
 - What are the essential aspects of the thesis that should be communicated to the *New Zealand Sociology* audience?

- ❖ Please do not simply replicate the dissertation abstract.
 - ❖ Submissions should include the author's full name, thesis title, the university and department, and the names and affiliations of PhD supervisors.
 - ❖ Submissions should also list any publications associated with the thesis.
